Targum Onkelos (or Onqelos; Hebrew: תרגום אונקלוס , Targūm 'Unqəlōs) is the primary Jewish Aramaic targum ("translation") of the Torah, accepted as an authoritative translated text of the Five Books of Moses and thought to have been written in the early 2nd-century CE.

Targum Jonathan is a western targum (interpretation) of the Torah (Pentateuch) from the land of Israel (as opposed to the eastern Babylonian Targum Onkelos).Its correct title was originally Targum Yerushalmi (Jerusalem Targum), which is how it was known in medieval times. But because of a printer's mistake it was later labeled Targum Jonathan, in reference to Jonathan ben Uzziel.

The best known of these is the so-called Targum of Onkelos, which was one of the earliest targums to be written down. Like most of the targums it had its origin in Pal. However, it was carried to Babylonia where there were great centers of Jewish learning in the 2nd and 3rd centuries a.d.

Note: The Aramaic Targum of Onkelos (Genesis 16:13) identifies the Angel of the Lord with the Shekhinah, the concrete manifestation of the presence of God. Shem Hameforash. The sacred Name for God was spoken only 10 times once per year (during Yom Kippur) by the Kohen Gadol.

The Targum Onkelos leaves the phrase untranslated and is so quoted in the Talmud (B. B. 73a). The "I am that I am" of the Authorized Version is based on this view. I am that I am (Hebrew: אֲנִי־אֵלֹהִים, pronounced ' Ehyeh asher ehyeh') is the sole response used in (Exodus 3:14) when Moses asked for God's name.
